

Staff/Student reports they have tested positive for COVID-19

Staff/Student experiencing ONE or MORE SYMPTOMS before entry to building using screening protocol at home. Contact school to inform of symptoms

Staff notifies supervisor and student notifies campus nurse. Person remains home for 14 days (10 business days) from confirmed positive test

Staff/Student may return to district facility when all 4 criteria have been met:

- 72 hours have passed since recovery without fever reducing medication,
- improvement of symptoms
- a COVID-19 swab/test with a negative result,
- At least 14 days (10 business days) have passed since symptoms first appeared.

Staff/Student stays home. Nurse/Dept. Supervisor is contacted to report symptoms. Person remains isolated and it is recommended they contact a medical professional for guidance.

Staff/Student may return to district facility when all 4 criteria have been met:

- 72 hours have passed since recovery without fever reducing medication,
- improvement of symptoms
- a COVID-19 swab/test with a negative result,
- At least 14 days (10 business days) have passed since symptoms first appeared.

Staff/Students experiencing ONE or MORE symptoms of COVID-19 during the school day.


Supervisor/Nurse will isolate person immediately from other students and/or staff. Person cannot remove mask. Person will complete screening checklist.

Schools should immediately clean areas used by the staff/student who shows symptoms while at school.

Staff/Student may return to district facility when all 4 criteria have been met:

- 72 hours have passed since recovery without fever reducing medication,
- improvement of symptoms
- a COVID-19 swab/test with a negative result,
- At least 14 days (10 business days) have passed since symptoms first appeared.

COVID Response Team (CRT) identifies other students or staff who were present in the same class/group two days (48 hrs) prior to the person's symptom onset date OR date staff/student tested positive. CRT Lead reports findings, including quarantine needs, to Lead Nurse who will submit to Student Support Services.



Campus principals will work with Communications Director, to send written notification of possible exposure to all staff and parents of all students present in the same class/group.

Staff/Student reports someone at home/work has tested positive.

Person is required to contact campus nurse or supervisor.

This would be considered "close contact" and to someone with COVID-19. Person CANNOT enter the building.* It is recommended staff/ student contact a medical professional for guidance and remain home to selfquarantine.

Person CANNOT return until selfquarantine for 14 days (10 business days) after the last day of contact with the person who tested positive.

*The COVID Response Team (CRT) investigates to determine when staff/student was last in the building to determine any contact tracing needs.

Staff/Student reports someone in their home was exposed to someone who tested positive OR has symptoms.

If the "someone" is symptomatic and/or awaiting test results

If the "someone" at home is asymptomatic, but just "exposed," staff/student may return to district facility. No need to self-quarantine or notify any staff. Monitoring symptoms is encouraged.

All students and staff who were in "close contact" CANNOT return to campus until all 4 criteria have been met 72 hours have passed since recovery without fever reducing medication, improvement of symptoms, an acute infection test with a negative result, and at least 14 days (10 business days) have passed from date of exposure.
